- Location:** Riverside Shooting Club (Duncan's Outdoors) 501 Salzburg Bay City, MI 48706
- Eligibility:** This competition is open to all competitors born in 1986 or later. All competitors must be members of USA Shooting.
- Residence:** Each competitor may claim residence in only one state and must declare the state of residence on the entry form. All residents are eligible for the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place USA Shooting State Championship medallions. Non-residents may compete for automatic and at-large invitations to the National Championship and are encouraged to do so.
- State Resident Qualifiers:** USA Shooting will issue official invitations to the National Junior Olympic Shooting Championships (NJOSC) for the high male and high female resident from each state JORC, provided they fire a minimum qualifying score. Resident collegiate and/or military competitors are eligible for state resident champion awards and are also eligible for resident state qualifier invitations.

- Entry:** Shooters may not compete in more than one state JOSC, however. Juniors who fire in their own home state JOSC will not be allowed to shoot for an invitation in another state. Juniors from states which are not holding a state JOSC and those who cannot attend their own state JOSC will be allowed to enter the automatic/at-large division in other states. At entry, non-resident juniors must declare if they are shooting for an at-large/automatic invitation or for score only. For these reasons, there are two entry divisions on the JOSC entry card.

Residents may choose to enter the Automatic/At-large category instead of the Resident Qualifier category if they are confident they can shoot above the automatic score and secure an invitation. This would allow another competitor to receive the State Qualifier invitation.

- A. **Resident Qualifier** – Competitors shooting in their declared state of permanent residency. The score fired by a competitor in this division will be the only score fired in any state JOSCS that will be considered for invitation. Competitors in this division may not compete for invitations in any other state. Competitors in this category are eligible to be the state resident qualifier to the National JOSCS.
- B. **Automatic/At-large** – Competitors who have not and will not enter another JOSCS for at-large/automatic invitations may enter this division. They are eligible for at-large/automatic invitations to the National JOSCS.

Teams: All teams entered in the team competition must represent USAS affiliated clubs. Teams will consist of three firing competitors.

Categories: The following categories will be used for individual and team competition, based upon their age in 2007.
Junior (J1); age 18-20; competitors born from 1987-1989
Intermediate Junior (J2); age 15-17; competitors born from 1990-1992
Sub-Junior (J3); age 14 and under; competitors born in 1993 or later.

Classification: Classes will be the same as categories, with the addition of male and female.

Rules: Current USA Shooting Rules will govern.

Course of Fire:

	Men/Women
Match 1	60/40 shots Standing
Match 2	3-person team

Time Limit: Match 1 1 hour, 45 minutes/1 hour, 15 minutes

Fire Arm: USAS Rule 7.4.2

Sights: USAS Rule 7.4.2.3

Distance: 10 meters

Targets: A-5/10

Coaching:	Coaching will not be allowed
Scoring Protests:	A scoring protest of \$2.00 per match will be charged.
Ties:	All ties will be broken in accordance with USA Shooting Rules.
Junior Olympic Participation Pins:	A participant pin provided by USA Shooting will be given to each competitor.
Awards:	Provided by USA Shooting – USA Shooting will provide a medallion to the top resident individual, silver medallion to 2 nd place resident individual and a bronze medallion to the 3 rd . place resident individual. In addition the MRPA will provide individual and team awards based upon the following: 1-5 first, 6-10, second, 11-15 third, etc.
Score Sheets:	Special score sheets will be used. They are to be filled in completely and signed by the competitor to be considered for invitation to the National JOSOC. LEGIBLE handwriting is required. If we cannot read your handwriting you may not get your invitation.
Make Entry:	Entries should be made using the entry form enclosed with this program. Mail entries to: Riverside Shooting Club, c/o Tom Monto PO Box 2502 Midland, MI 48641-2502.
Entry Fees:	Entry fees are \$15.00 for Match 1 and \$5.00 for Match 2 (Must shoot match 1 in order to be eligible for match 2)
Entries Close:	30 minutes before the relay is to start, or when relay is full.
Cancellations:	Cancellations received one week in advance, or earlier will receive full refund. No other refunds.
Schedule:	Relay 1 (AM) 9:00 AM December 17, 2006 (air) Relay 3 (PM) 3:00 PM December 17, 2006 (air)
Note:	There are a set of AM and PM relays. Shooters shooting both air & smallbore <u>MUST</u> pick which set they want to shoot (i.e. Relay 1 & 2 OR 3 & 4). THERE WILL NO SPLITTING OF RELAYS.
Miscellaneous:	Eye protection is mandatory. Open Bore Indicators (OBI) are required
