

**The Michigan Rifle and Pistol Association presents:  
The Michigan Long Range State Championship  
September 13-14, 2008**

**Location:** Camp Grayling National Guard Base, Grayling, Michigan

**Eligibility:** Open to individual NRA members or members of an NRA affiliated Junior Rifle Club. All competitors must be members of the Michigan Rifle and Pistol Association or other home State Association. Competitors may join at site.

**Rules:** Current NRA High Power Rifle Rules will govern. This is an NRA Registered match.

**Entries:** Will be made by using an SR-1 card accompanied by check or money order, payable to MRPA HP LR. Circle the number of each event in which you wish to fire. Be sure to indicate your correct NRA classification and NRA member number. Mail entry card with correct fees to the address listed above. Post entries will be accepted up to the stated limit of the range without a late penalty.

**Fees:** Individual Package Price Both Days \$70.00. Saturday or Sunday only: \$40.00. Those who wish to practice can shoot for \$30.00 per day. Juniors with a Long Range classification shoot for free - no awards.

**Squadding & Firing Times:** Squadding starts at 07:30 on the 1000 yard. Firing starts each day at 08:00. Squadding tickets for individual matches will be issued from the Statistical Office on the range. Paid pit pullers are generally available – call ahead to reserve.

**Classification:** The NRA Long Range classification system will be used in all matches. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master Class or use their conventional High Power classification. Rule 19.6 - Assigned Classification, or 19.2 - Temporary Classification apply.

**Rifle Allowed for record firing:** There will be four divisions: Service Rifle - Rules 3.1, 3.3.1 or 3.1.2; Any rifle - Rule 3.2; Palma Rifle - Rule 3.3.3; and an Any rifle / Optical Sight (AROS) class, where scores will be reported to NRA. The AROS class cannot be combined with any other class and is not eligible for winning the match in any conventional class, category or the championship. A separate class will exist for any match designated as "Rules 7.19(a), 3.3.3, Palma rifle, Iron Sights" and will allow Any Rifle / Iron Sights. Minimum of 5 must be registered for awards either by class or by rifle type.

**Range setup & practice:** Friday, set up - 1:00, 1000 yard practice - 3:00. \$5 to those who work, \$10 to others.

**Course of Fire Saturday:** Rules 7.19(a), 3.3.3, Palma rifle, Iron sights.  
Match 1 - Unlimited sighters and 15 shots for record prone in 22 minutes, slow-fire, 800 yards.  
Match 2 - Two sighters and 15 shots for record prone in 22 minutes, slow fire, 900 yards.  
Match 3 - Two sighters and 15 shots for record prone in 22 minutes, slow fire, 1000 yards.  
Match 4 - Unlimited sighters and 20 shots for record prone in 30 minutes, slow-fire, 1000 yards.

**Course of Fire Sunday:** Any Rifle / Any Sight.  
Match 5 - Unlimited sighters and 20 shots for record prone in 30 minutes, slow-fire, 1000 yards.  
Match 6 - Unlimited sighters and 20 shots for record prone in 30 minutes, slow-fire, 1000 yards.  
Match 7 - Unlimited sighters and 20 shots for record prone in 30 minutes, slow-fire, 1000 yards.

Match 8 - Aggregate of matches 1, 2, 3, and 4.  
Match 9 - Aggregate of matches 5 - 7.  
Match 10 - Aggregate of scores from Matches 8 and 9.

**All matches** will be fired on the standard LR targets and Rule 5.6 prone position. The Match Director reserves the right to modify the course of fire and pit rotation based on number of competitors and range conditions. Unless otherwise stated, all matches will fire in a 3-relay rotation.

**Categories, Classes, and Awards Disposition:** There will be separate categories and classes. Awards are for fired matches, and aggregates only. There must be 5 or more entries in a classification or rifle class for one award, 10 or more for two awards, and 15 or more for three awards. If there are fewer than 5 High Masters entered, they must fire for open awards only. The High Master Class, and Any Rifle / Optical Sight (AROS) class may not be combined with any class. The AROS class may not fire for any open awards. The F-class will have its own awards. The winner of Match 10 will be declared the Michigan Long Range State Champion. Only Michigan residents may be declared state champion.
