

**The Michigan Rifle and Pistol Association presents:
The Michigan Long Range / F-Class Regional
Aug 6-8, 2010**

Location: Range 10, Camp Grayling National Guard Base, Grayling, Michigan.

Entry, Squadding & Firing Times: Entry and Squadding starts at 7:15 on the 1000 yard line. Firing starts at 08:00.

Entries: Entries will be made on SR-1 cards at Range 10 on the day of firing. Make checks or money orders payable to MRPA-LR. Entries will be accepted to the limit of the range; range space has always been sufficient for the number of entrants. New Competitors: To ensure entrance to Camp Grayling, notify the Match Director one week prior to shooting.

Fees: Individual Package Price 3 Days: \$100.00. Single day: \$40.00, Additional Days: \$30. Those who wish to practice can shoot for \$30.00 per day. Juniors with any NRA classification card shoot free - no awards.

Eligibility: Competitors must be members of the Michigan Rifle and Pistol Association or their home state association. Competitors must complete a MRPA Long Range release of liability yearly. NRA membership is not required.

Pit Duty/ Pit Pullers: All competitors must perform pit duty or provide a substitute puller. Paid pit pullers are generally available--contact the Match Director. A 3-relay rotation requiring individual target operation will generally be used.

Rules & Shooter Classification: Current NRA High Power Rifle Rules govern. This is an NRA Registered match. All matches will be fired on the standard LR targets using Rule 5.6, Prone Position. The NRA Long Range classification system applies. Unclassified competitors compete in the Master Class or use their High Power classification. Rule 19.6 - Assigned Classification, or 19.2 - Temporary Classification apply. The Match Director reserves the right to modify the course of fire and pit rotation based on number of competitors, weather, and range conditions.

Rifle Divisions Allowed for Record Firing: There will be two rifle divisions: LR Rifle and F-Class Rifle. The LR division includes classes for Service Rifle--Rule 3.1, Palma Rifle--Rule 3.3.3, Match Rifle--Rule 3.2, 3.3.1, & 3.3.2, and Any Sight Rifle-- Rule 3.4. The F-Class division includes classes for F(o) Rifle and F(tr) Rifle--Rule Section 22 applies.

Range setup & practice: Thursday, set up 1:00, 1000 yard practice 3:00. Set up personnel shoot free; \$10 to others.

Course of Fire Friday: Any Rifle / Any Sight.

Match 1 - Unlimited sighters and 20 shots for record prone in 30 minutes, slow-fire, 1000 yards.

Match 2 - Unlimited sighters and 20 shots for record prone in 30 minutes, slow fire, 1000 yards.

Match 3 - Two-Man Team Match, Unlimited sighters and 20 shots for record prone in 30 minutes, slow fire, 1000 yards.

Course of Fire Saturday: Rules 7.19(a), 3.3.3, Iron sights.

Match 4 - Unlimited sighters and 15 shots for record prone in 22 minutes, slow-fire, 800 yards.

Match 5 - Two sighters and 15 shots for record prone in 22 minutes, slow fire, 900 yards.

Match 6 - Two sighters and 15 shots for record prone in 22 minutes, slow fire, 1000 yards.

Match 7 - Unlimited sighters and 20 shots for record prone in 30 minutes, slow-fire, 1000 yards.

Course of Fire Sunday: Rules 7.19(a), 3.3.3, Iron sights.

Match 8 - Unlimited sighters and 15 shots for record prone in 22 minutes, slow-fire, 800 yards.

Match 9 - Two sighters and 15 shots for record prone in 22 minutes, slow fire, 900 yards.

Match 10 - Two sighters and 15 shots for record prone in 22 minutes, slow fire, 1000 yards.

Match 11 - Aggregate of matches 1, 2 and 3.

Match 12 - Aggregate of matches 4, 5, 6 and 7.

Match 13 - Aggregate of matches 8, 9, and 10.

Match 14 - Aggregate of Matches 12 and 13.

Match 15 - Aggregate of scores fired in Matches 1-10.

Awards Disposition of Rifle Divisions and Classes, Shooter Classifications: There will be awards for each fired match and aggregate for all rifle divisions, classes, and shooter classifications. There must be 5 or more entries in a rifle class/ classification for one award or 10 or more for two awards, etc. If there are fewer than 5 High Masters entered, they will fire for open awards only. The High Master Class will not be combined with any other class. **REGIONAL AWARDS:** The Match 14 Winners for LR Rifle, F(o) Rifle, and F(tr) Rifle will be declared the 2010 Michigan Long Range Regional Champions - NRA Regional Gold Medallions, 2nd place - NRA Regional Silver Medallions, 3rd place - NRA Regional Bronze Medallions. Only Palma rifles shall be eligible for Regional awards in the LR division.
